Susan's marriage record (1840 GRO) has the spelling GOODRUM, but other records have the spellings GOODRAM or GOODERHAM for her family.

LORD LOYD LLOYD

The ancestral name for this family was LORD according to baptismal records for earlier generations. For some branches, the spelling changed during the nineteenth century to LOYD and then LLOYD.

On this chart I have used the surname spelling entered in the GRO birth record where found, followed by the GRO marriage spelling (in brackets) where that is different.

Martha and Alice were sisters. Their parents were John SHREEVE, railway gatekeeper then market gardener, born in Norton Subcourse, Norfolk, and his wife Rebecca believed to be Rebecca [ROBERTS].

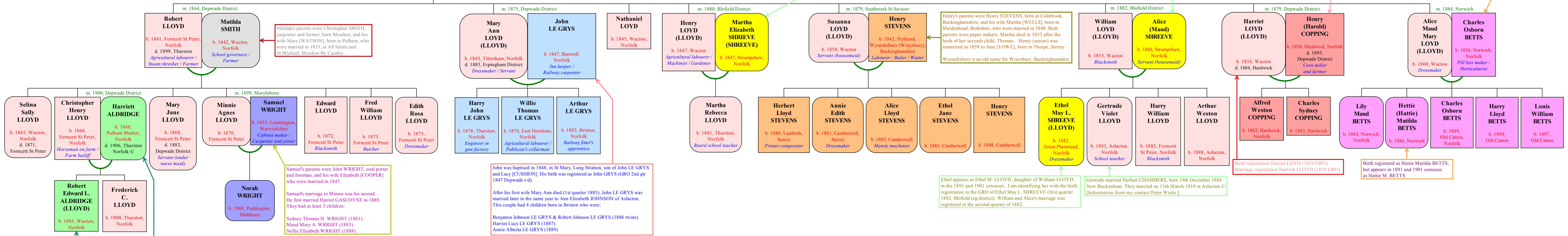
Martha's birth registration was as Martha Elizabeth SHRIEVE (1847 GRO). She married as Martha Elizabeth SHREEVE (1880 GRO).

Alice's birth registration (1860 GRO) was in the name Alice SHREEVE, her marriage (1882 GRO) in the name Alice Maud SHREEVE.

Henry's parents were Benjamin COPPING, corn miller, and his wife Hannah [GOODSWEN] who were married in 1844. Both parents were born in Hardwick.

After Henry's first wife, Harriet [LLOYD], died, Henry married Angelina Louisa BOWEN in 1888, in Swainsthorpe, Norfolk. Angelina was born in Stepney, and appears with forename Amelia in the 1891 and 1901 censuses. From this second marriage there were three children: James Benjamin COPPING (1889), John Warren COPPING (1891), George Valentine COPPING (1893). In the registration of Henry's second marriage his name was recorded as Henry Harold COPPING, but his birth, first marriage, and death records have no middle name.

Charles's parents were Osborn BETTS, pill box maker, born in New Buckenham, Norfolk, and his wife Eliza (or Elizah) [SMART], who were married 1853 Norwich.



Matilda's parents were Christopher SMITH, carpenter and farmer, born Moulton, and his wife Mary [WATSON], born in Pulham, who were married in 1835, at All Saints and St Michael, Moulton By Cantley.

Henry's parents were Henry STEVENS, born in Colnbrook, Buckinghamshire, and his wife Martha [WELLS], born in Maidenhead, Berkshire, who were married in 1848. Both parents were paper makers. Martha died in 1852 after the birth of her seventh child, Thomas. Henry (senior) was remarried in 1859 to Jane [LOWE], born in Thorpe, Surrey. Wyrardisbury is an old name for Wraysbury, Buckinghamshire.

Samuel's parents were John WRIGHT, coal porter and foreman, and his wife Elizabeth [COOPER] who were married in 1847.

Samuel's marriage to Minnie was his second. He first married Harriet GASCOYNE in 1880. They had at least 3 children:

Sydney Thomas H. WRIGHT (1881).
Maud Mary A. WRIGHT (1883).
Nellie Elizabeth WRIGHT (1888).

John was baptised in 1848, in St Mary, Long Stratton, son of John LE GRYS and Lucy [CUSHION]. His birth was registered as John GRYS (GRO 2nd qtr 1847 Depwade r-d).

After his first wife Mary Ann died (1st quarter 1885), John LE GRYS was married later in the same year to Ann Elizabeth JOHNSON of Aslacton. This couple had 4 children born in Briston who were:

Benjamin Johnson LE GRYS & Robert Johnson LE GRYS (1886 twins).
Harriet Lucy LE GRYS (1887).
Annie Alberta LE GRYS (1889).

Ethel appears as Ethel M. LLOYD, daughter of William LLOYD, in the 1891 and 1901 censuses. I am identifying her with the birth registration in the GRO of Ethel May L. SHREEVE (first quarter 1882, Blofield reg-district). William and Alice's marriage was registered in the second quarter of 1882.

Gertrude married Herbert CHAMBERS, born 19th December 1884 New Buckenham. They married on 13th March 1919 at Aslacton ©. [Information from my contact Peter Waite.]

Birth registration Harriet LOYD (1854 GRO).
Marriage registration Harriett LLOYD (1879 GRO).

Birth registered as Hettie Matilda BETTS, but appears in 1891 and 1901 censuses as Hattie M. BETTS.

This person appears in 1901 as Robert E. LLOYD, age 6, son of Christopher LLOYD. I am identifying him as the same person whose birth was registered (1st quarter 1895 Depwade r-d) as Robert Edward L. ALDRIDGE, but this could be wrong.

Harriet died tragically in a gun accident in Tharston in 1906. I have a copy of the death certificate and a newspaper report of the inquest - both provided by my contact Peter Waite. To view these, go to my Genealogy Index page (url above) and look at BULLEN - BMD transcripts.
