

On 25 Oct 1863, in Topcroft, Edward FENN was baptised son of William FENN, labourer, and his wife Sarah Ann [UTTING], who were married in Topcroft in 1862. The spelling in the civil registration is Edward FEN (GRO 1863 4th quarter Loddon Registration District).

In the 1871 census, Edward FENN (age 7, born Topcroft), and William UTTING (age 9, born Poringland, Norfolk) who was probably Sarah's natural child, and Edward's half brother, were both described as "crow boy", presumably employed to scare the crows from the crop.

James's parents were William WEBB, a woodman born in Ditchingham, and his wife Harriet [BANHAM], who were married in Bedingham in 1835.

In 1901, James and Jane WEBB have with them, as well as 5 of their own children, Gertrude WEBB, granddaughter, age 4 months, born Woodton. I have not found out how she fits in, but from the name it seems likely she is daughter of Gertrude Ellen WEBB, who at that time was working as a domestic cook for the family of Harry LEMAN, an export manager, in Croydon.

Maud's parents were Louis WHITING, a shoemaker, born in Shotesham, Norfolk, and his wife Emma [BULLEN], of Bungay, who were married in Norwich in 1864.

Caroline's parents were Robert THROWER, a groom born in Hampnall, and his wife Emma [HARVEY], born in Fornsett, who were married in 1861.

In 1891, Blanch was a patient, age 9, at Norwich and Norfolk Hospital. She must have recovered for she is back home with parents and siblings in 1901.

Cecil is probably to be identified with "Last Cical WEBB" whose birth was registered in Loddon registration district (which includes Woodton) in 2nd qtr 1887.

In 1901, Alfred and his young family are lodging with elderly retired couple Loius (or Lewis) and Mary BRUNNING in Hedenham, and have with them Alfred's younger sister Ethel, age 12, as well as their own children, Ellen (3) and Robert (1).
Ten years earlier, Alfred's wife Caroline was servant for the BRUNNINGs who were then living in Hempnall.

Charlotte's birth was registered as Charlotte FISK in the 4th quarter of 1869 in Wangford registration district which includes the village of Barsham. Her parents were John FISK, an agricultural labourer, and his wife Mary. When Charlotte married James WEBB in 1897, her surname was recorded as FISKE in the GRO.
