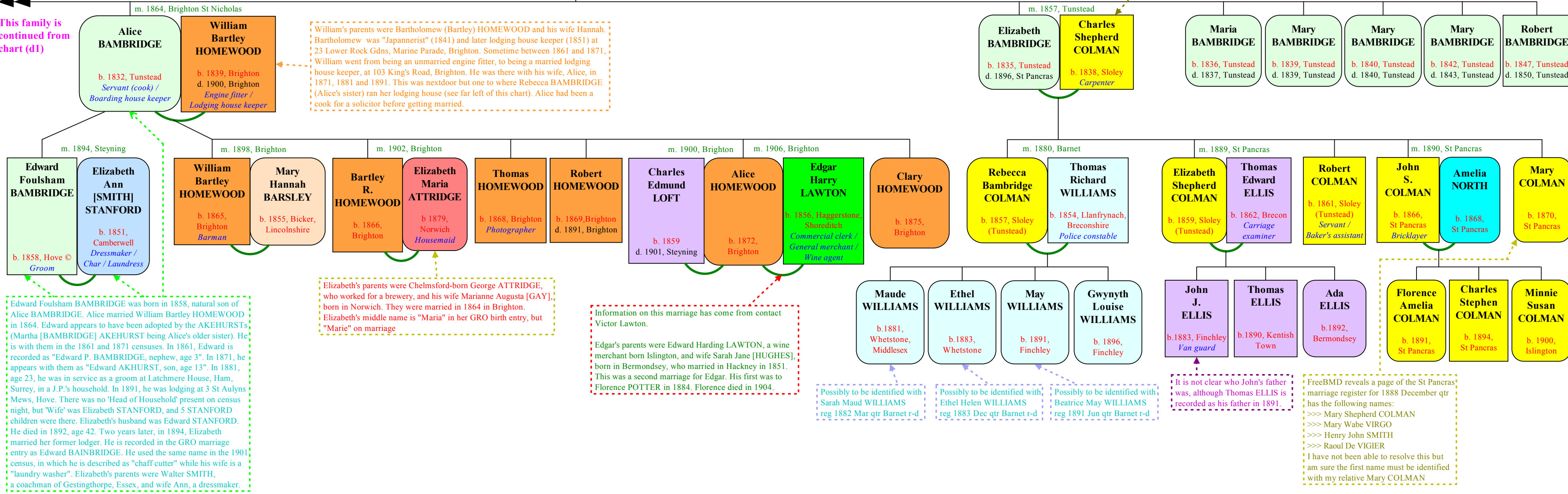

In Mary's 1803 baptismal record in the parish registers of Belaugh, her parents were recorded as John ALLEN & Mary [MORLEY].

Charles's parents were Charles S. COLMAN, farmer, born Sloley, and his wife, Mary [HOLMAN], born Dilham, Norfolk, who were married in 1836 in Dilham. The younger sister of Charles (junior), Ann COLMAN, married his nephew, John Kerrison BAMBRIDGE. See chart (d1).

William's parents were Bartholomew (Bartley) HOMEWOOD and his wife Hannah. Bartholomew was "Japannerist" (1841) and later lodging house keeper (1851) at 23 Lower Rock Gdns, Marine Parade, Brighton. Sometime between 1861 and 1871, William went from being an unmarried engine fitter, to being a married lodging house keeper, at 103 King's Road, Brighton. He was there with his wife, Alice, in 1871, 1881 and 1891. This was nextdoor but one to where Rebecca BAMBRIDGE (Alice's sister) ran her lodging house (see far left of this chart). Alice had been a cook for a solicitor before getting married.

Edward Foulsham BAMBRIDGE was born in 1858, natural son of Alice BAMBRIDGE. Alice married William Bartley HOMEWOOD in 1864. Edward appears to have been adopted by the AKEHURSTs (Martha [BAMBRIDGE] AKEHURST being Alice's older sister). He is with them in the 1861 and 1871 censuses. In 1861, Edward is recorded as "Edward P. BAMBRIDGE, nephew, age 3". In 1871, he appears with them as "Edward AKHURST, son, age 13". In 1881, age 23, he was in service as a groom at Latchmere House, Ham, Surrey, in a J.P.'s household. In 1891, he was lodging at 3 St Aulyns Mews, Hove. There was no 'Head of Household' present on census night, but 'Wife' was Elizabeth STANFORD, and 5 STANFORD children were there. Elizabeth's husband was Edward STANFORD. He died in 1892, age 42. Two years later, in 1894, Elizabeth married her former lodger. He is recorded in the GRO marriage entry as Edward BAINBRIDGE. He used the same name in the 1901 census, in which he is described as "chaff cutter" while his wife is a "laundry washer". Elizabeth's parents were Walter SMITH, a coachman of Gestingthorpe, Essex, and wife Ann, a dressmaker.

Elizabeth's parents were Chelmsford-born George ATTRIDGE, who worked for a brewery, and his wife Marianne Augusta [GAY], born in Norwich. They were married in 1864 in Brighton. Elizabeth's middle name is "Maria" in her GRO birth entry, but "Marie" on marriage

Information on this marriage has come from contact Victor Lawton.
Edgar's parents were Edward Harding LAWTON, a wine merchant born Islington, and wife Sarah Jane [HUGHES], born in Bermondsey, who married in Hackney in 1851. This was a second marriage for Edgar. His first was to Florence POTTER in 1884. Florence died in 1904.

It is not clear who John's father was, although Thomas ELLIS is recorded as his father in 1891.

FreeBMD reveals a page of the St Pancras marriage register for 1888 December qtr has the following names:
